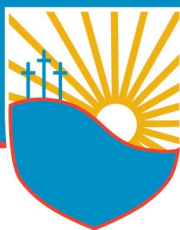


THE GREAT BOOK SWAP

NCS has been assigned the Wamparla House - Wamparla is the Arabana word for possum. Arabana country lies in the Western Lake Eyre region in SA.

How it works: Students can bring in books to donate leading up to the event. There will be a collection bin in the office. Please note that they must be in good condition. On the day of the event, students can purchase a book for a gold coin, which will be donated to the Indigenous Literacy Foundation. 1 gold coin buys one book, and 2 gold coins buys two books etc.
